

# **4-H Interactive Exhibit**

## 6th-8th Grade

Exhibits should provide informative information related to a 4-H project.



## **Guidelines to Follow**

- 1. All 4-H members **MUST** do individual exhibits. No partners.
- 2. **Do Not** use live animals or babies. **Do Not** use audience participation.
  - 3. Your exhibit presentation should be between 1-2 minutes long.
- 4. Your exhibits should answer the questions: **HOW,WHY, WHAT, IF**, etc.

# **Steps in Planning and Giving a Demonstration**

## 1. Planning

- A. Choose one idea/ 4-H Project
- B. Decide what specific information you want to talk about.
- C. Summarize your information into bullet points.

## 2. Preparation

- A. Secure all materials and equipment
- B. Use a trifold board, posters, or digital format (PowerPoint or Google Slides) include title and organize information in a logical order
- C. The exhibit should be easy to read. Use large and dark block letters.
- D. Prepare and **practice** your presentation.

#### 3. Presentation

- A. Speak loud and clear.
- B. Smile! Look at your audience. Try not to read your board!
- C. Set up your presentation so it looks nice and neat.
- D. At the end—Tell your source and ask for guestions.


